Notes from Worship Service

- 1. Doing business by forgiveness, that sounds exactly like the way God operates.
- 2. While we rejoice, along with Paul over God's forgiveness and pardon, I'm not sure we realize what all we have been given.
- 3. We have been brought into the penthouse, the top floor, the royal palace of God; that we might share in God's fellowship and glory and work. Grace is the access key.
- 4. The other great gift that comes from Christ Jesus is hope, and hope makes all the difference.
 - a. Our Christian hope comes from knowing we are deeply loved.
 - b. We have hope because God is bigger than our struggles and often uses them to transform us.
 - c. We have hope because in Christ we don't need to fear the future.

- 1. What insight, principle or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening or troubling? Explain.
- 2. Tell a story about a time you received a pardon or discovered an unexpected treasure.
