Notes from Worship Service

1. Graduations are a signal that something in our life is complete, finished and it's time to move ahead.
2. The Great Commission is the disciple's graduation day and Jesus is giving them a commencement speech.
3. While an occupation is a job, a vocation is a calling. Jesus is not giving the disciples an occupation as much as he was giving a vocation. The purpose of your life is tied into being my disciples.
4. The pew is not a lounge chair but rather a launching pad.
5. Jesus told the disciples to do 3 hard things: Make disciples, Baptize them, Teach them – and go everywhere.
6. The key to their success, and ours for that matter, is found in the last words of Jesus, "And surely I am with you always,"

3. How did you decide on your occupation?


