Notes from Worship Service

1. This is one of the problems when it comes to preaching on the second coming and the afterlife: It's like trying to describe the indescribable.
2. Notice Paul does not tell us to never grieve. Death hurts. Grief is an important spiritual, mental and emotional process for us to walk through. The important piece is we walk through it and not get stuck in it.
3. These facts are the foundation of our faith: Jesus lived, Jesus died, and Jesus rose again. Our hope for the future is not that we will never face death, but that someone died and came back.
4. The fellowship benefit
 - a. If we live and die in Christ we also rise in Christ.
 - b. We have an unbreakable bond with Jesus that even death cannot destroy.
5. By faith and by promise, we can dare to face the world's "asteroids" while serving God's kingdom now and forever.

3. What historical figure would you like to have a conversation with? Explain why.

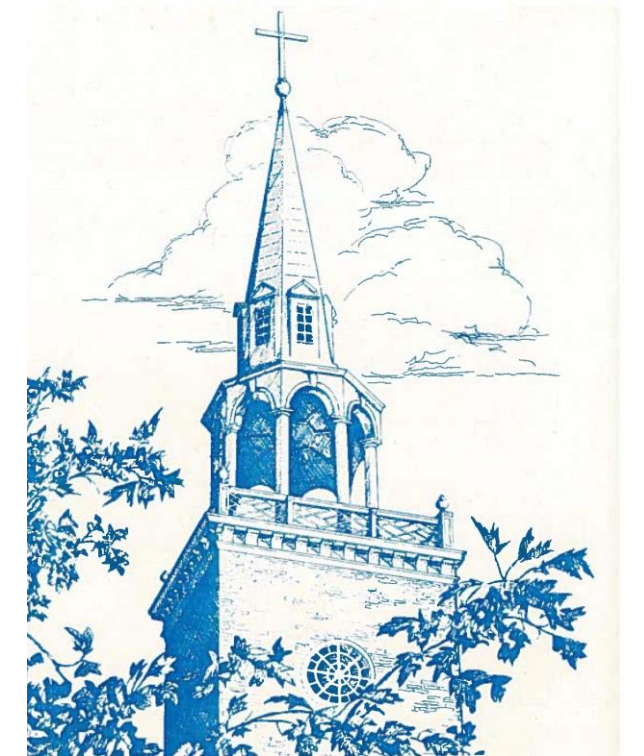
