

What a treat to be able to serve in your midst! You may know that I have a "history" with Parma-South, dating back to, well, dating the daughter of one of its ministers back in our college days. In more recent years I've attended Presbytery meetings at PSPC and, on occasion, a memorial service. I can't believe I actually get to serve in ministry functions at this church I've known for so long.

In my previous church I used to balk when people would call me a "Senior Pastor." Two reasons: first, the PC(USA) Book of Order does not describe any ministry position called a "Senior Pastor." The second reason was that I was the one and only pastor of the church I was serving, so who was I supposed to be "senior" to? So I never liked the term "Senior Pastor."

And now, after about 18 months of adjusting to the title of "Honorably Retired" member of the Presbytery of the Western Reserve, I've accepted the gracious invitation of your Session to serve as your "Gap Pastor" for these months until your next called pastor arrives.

But let's face it: "Gap Pastor" is not the most prestigious job title. "Gap...." Hmmm. Sounds like something's missing. Sounds like you can just take any person with a "Rev." in front of their name and stick them in there to fill the void.

But in a way, every one of us is a "gap minister." Each of us is called to continue the ministry of Jesus during this "gap" between his resurrection and that glorious day when, "in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet," we will all be changed [1 Cor. 15:52].

You probably know that the venerable London subway system has signs and announcements reminding riders to "Mind the gap" as they board and disembark the trains. You're supposed to pay extra attention to that space between the platform and the car. Let us, too, "mind the gap"—paying extra attention to how this unique time before the arrival of the next pastor can be the time we've been waiting for to grow in fellowship, to explore new ways of serving, to deepen our devotion to following the way of Jesus in our daily lives.


