"I let people walk all over me." That could be someone's exhausted lament. But it also could be the silent cry of the sandstone steps leading up to our sanctuary's main entrance. For nearly 75 years those grand steps have had thousands upon thousands of shoes tread up or down them. Worshipers. Ushers. Ministers. Brides and grooms. Pallbearers. And probably no one took notice of them. The stairs were, well... they were "just there."

But decades of use caught up. The sandstone had worn away in some places, chipped and cracked in others. There were hazards that needed to be addressed. So in recent months our Properties team arranged to have the steps repaired. They didn't replace the steps—that easily could have cost ten times the cost of repair. Plus, it would have looked a little out of place: gleaming brand-new steps leading into a well-maintained but "mature" building? Not a good look. So they opted to have the steps repaired. The sandstone steps may be blemished by age, wear, and repair, but once again they are sturdy and safe.

To me, the restoration of the stone steps is symbolic of what we as a church are trying to do: we seek to offer an open, expectant invitation to the community in which we live. We want to make the way easy for the newcomer. We want to be welcoming and encouraging to the stranger. We want others to journey with us, just as in biblical times the faithful joined together as they pilgrimaged to the holy city of Jerusalem. Psalm 24 includes some verses that pilgrims sang as they approached the holy precincts:

- <sup>3</sup> Who has the right to go up the Lord's hill? Who may enter his holy Temple?
- <sup>4</sup> Those who are pure in act and in thought, who do not worship idols or make false promises.
- <sup>5</sup> The Lord will bless them and save them....

Yes, we can be agents of God's blessing upon our community. And whether the community ascends the grand front stairs to our sanctuary, or they use the mobility-friendly bell tower entrance, or they come in through the office portal or some other entry, let's be sure to offer a sincere welcome to the stranger in our midst. See you in church.


